- The first Underground trains were steam trains with wooden carriages.
- There are more types of transport available now than in the Victorian time period.
- The Victorians introduced rules to keep us safe on the road.
- Vehicles today are a lot safer.
- The features of vehicles have changed since the introduction of the battery.
- The material that vehicles are made from has changed from wood to metal.
- The development of transport allows us to get to places quicker than in the past.
