Big Question – Science: What is the difference between a whale and a shark? This term, we will be continuing with our science topic about animals. We will be looking at how scientists classify animals using the Linnaean system. What's more, we will be investigating other groups of living things: plants and micro-organisms!

Big Question – History: Who is British? This term, we will be investigating who makes up the British population. We will be learning about migration to Britain after the Second World War. Which people came to settle in Britain? Why did they come? What was life like for them when they arrived? All will be revealed in this term's history lessons...

Mathematics

New learning will be focused on **percentages**. We will be covering the following objectives:

- Finding equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages
- Comparing fractions, decimals and percentages
- Finding percentages of an amount

We will also be looking at shape (2D shapes, 3D shapes, types of triangles) and measure (area and perimeter, volume, converting mm, cm, m and km).

P.E.


