Big Question

“What was it like when the Queen came to the throne in 1953?”

This topic will allow the children to take a closer look at the Queen and what she does.



Children will also explore aspects of life in 1953 and compare it to their own lives now.

Literacy

Children will research and write their own reports on nocturnal hunters - owls and foxes

Writing will focus on non fiction features:

- Layout features such as Title, subheading, photo, caption
- Time conjunctions and sentence starters
- Technical vocabulary and glossaries

We will also be writing more of our own narrative.
